Plastics – Which Ones Are Safer for Your Health?

Last month I spoke about how some of our everyday products may interfere with our health especially our endocrine system. Just to follow-up I have compiled a list of safer choices and those which to avoid. To recap in February of 2008 , an environmental group, the Center for Health Environment and Justice called for an immediate moratorium of Bisphenol A in baby bottles, food, and beverage containers. Bisphenol A (BPA) is a chemical produced in large quantities for use primarily in the production of polycarbonate plastics and epoxy resins. This chemical leaches out when heated and it is thought to be an endocrine disrupter. Ninety-five percent of all baby bottles on the market are made with BPA. Studies conducted on laboratory animals and cell cultures have linked low doses of BPA to obesity, diabetes, thyroid disease, breast cancer, prostate cancer and other illnesses. Nine states have introduced legislation that would restrict the use of BPA in children’s products, including baby bottles. Minnesota was the first state to pass legislation this year. Similar bans are under consideration in California, New York and Connecticut. However, to contradict the environmentalists last year, the Food and Drug Administration ruled that BPA was safe and asked independent scientists to review its conclusion. After the report was criticized as flawed, FDA ordered a re-assessment. It continues to rate the chemical as safe despite independent research suggesting that the chemical mimics hormones such as estrogen and could be linked to other serious health problems. So I provide this information for each of you to make your own decision. plastics are safer for yourself and our environment? PET : Polyethylene terephthalate ethylene, used for soft drinks (#1 Coke), juice, water, detergents, cleaner and peanut butter containers. Easiest to recycle into T-shirts, carpets, shopping bags. - *Safer choice*

HDPE: High Density Polyethylene, comprises “cloudy looking” milk and water containers, hair care products and liquid detergent. It is also found in toys. Recyclable – *Safer choice*

LDPE: Low Density polyethylene is an elastic form of plastic -used in grocery store bags, most plastic wraps and some bottles. Recyclable but finding a recycling plant can be cost prohibitive. – *Safer Choice*

PP: Polypropylene, used in most Rubbermaid, deli soup, syrup and yogurt containers, straws, tops of bottles and other clouded plastic containers including baby bottles. Recycle. *Safer Choice.*

PVC: or V: Polyvinyl chloride seen as clear food packaging and plastic “cling” wrap, some plastic squeeze bottle, cooking oil, peanut butter jars, detergent and window cleaner bottles. AVOID – difficult to recycle.

PS: Polystyrene, used in Styrofoam, food trays, egg cartons, disposable cups and bowl, carry out containers, plastic food utensils. AVOID – cannot be recycled

Further tips:

- *In addition PET and HDPE water bottles are recommended for one time use only.*
- *Avoid heating food/liquids in plastics in the microwave. (Chemicals may be released when heated)*
- *Use waxed paper or paper towels instead of cling wrap in the microwave.*
